To Peter S., Coordinator small fire-camp prisons in N. CA. H&I:

Peter, here is my most current report of what's happening at the Deadwood Fire Camp prison in Siskiyou Co. A couple of months have went by since the last of our regular group of inmates who were coming to the meetings in Deadwood got out. There was a slump of inmates coming to meeting for several weeks. But in the past month now inmates have started to come to the meetings there. There have been from four to one and two inmates coming at a time. At least one inmate told our contact chairs there that he'd be there every time possible. That's great news. When I last went inside there we had seven inmates at the meeting. One note though....the prison has started sending inmates to the meeting who say that they do not have an alcohol problem. So we will see how that all works out. When I went in the guards announced our meeting as NA/AA and I corrected them fast about that and told them that we are only AA....

I've given up my position of going in on a regular basis at Deadwood as there are more AA members who wish to join us and go into Deadwood than we have vacancies. Most recently we have finally gotten Mike P. cleared. He is a great addition to our team. Mike is a previous contact chair there as well as a previous coordinator. Several years back Mike was also our H&I Area Chair and a previous Regional Chair.

I have elected myself to go into Deadwood on the months with a fifth Monday so I will schedule Mike to go with me for the time being. We have such a dedicated crew at Deadwood that there just are no vacancies to add anyone on the schedule at this time.

But.....consequently, we have no black nights either. These men and women are completely dedicated to carrying the message of hope to those inmates. I've been involved in AA service for over twenty five years and I've never seen a more dedicated bunch of alcoholics anywhere!

Next is my report for what's happening in Intermountain Fire Camp prison in Lassen County.

As you already know it's a long drive for me at 110 miles one way. It's also going to be a

challenge this winter because to get there it's a ride over five mountain passes / summits that top out at 4300 feet and over. Very beautiful drive. I don't mind it at all. But snow has become a problem for a few months. At this time, we've only had one time where we didn't get to the meeting.

Not to worry though as I've arranged to let the prison know if we cannot make it.

Still, the guys are coming to our meetings there. We have never had a meeting yet where no inmates have showed up for it. We currently have four guys going to the prison meetings in Intermountain including myself. Ted C. and Bill R. are neighbors and they go both ways, meaning to Deadwood where one of them drives and to Intermountain where the other drives. They are becoming a very dedicated H&I team. They go to the prison every first Tuesday of each month.

Then we have Mark R. Mark is a dedicated H&I member who is taking the meeting into Intermountain on the second Tuesday of each month. Mark has a long drive to do this but he's also dedicated to doing it and from what the inmates tell me he's doing a great job! Next I go currently the third, fourth, and any fifth Tuesdays of each month. This is truly a joy for me. Sometimes I take someone who is cleared with me and sometimes not.

Bob F. has taken a commitment to go once a week to Intermountain and has went with me once. Scotty has been cleared and has yet to make it to the prison meeting.

I have one member of AA waiting to be cleared for Intermountain. Dave H. will be a very welcome addition to our group taking our message of sobriety to those who are incarcerated.

So things are working well at Intermountain and I love those inmates who are coming. We have four who have been coming regularly. And though one was recently transferred to Alder Camp another has come forward and is coming to the meetings regularly.

Now one last thing on this long-winded report. As you already know one of our Deadwood H&I Volunteers has moved. That would be Tom C. Now Tom and I have spoken since he moved and he may very well get involved in carrying the message of hope to another fire-camp close to where he has moved which does not have an AA meeting there at this time. How great is that?! If he does you'll, of course, be the first to know....

Peter, I thank you for all your efforts at coordinating these fire-camp prisons. I can see that it would take time and effort to do a good job with all of them. I applaud you because you are doing more than a good job, you are doing a great job!
